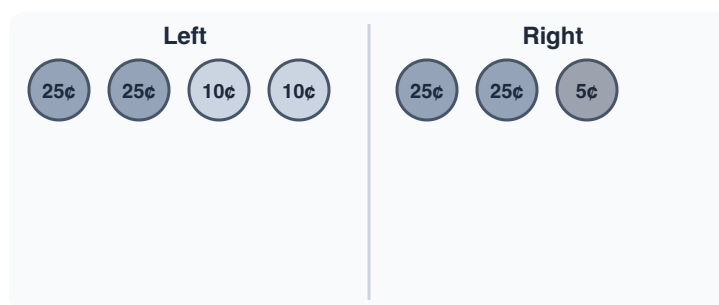

1. **1¢** A penny is worth 1¢.
2. **33** $25 \times 0 + 10 \times 1 + 5 \times 4 + 1 \times 3 = 33\text{¢}$.
3. **25¢** A quarter is worth 25¢.
4. **10¢** A dime is worth 10¢.
5. **5¢** A nickel is worth 5¢.
6. **33** Add the coins: 33¢.
7. **10¢** This is a dime, worth 10¢.
8. **Left** Left = 70¢, Right = 55¢. Left is more.
9. **54** $25 \times 0 + 10 \times 3 + 5 \times 4 + 1 \times 4 = 54\text{¢}$.
10. **117** $25 \times 3 + 10 \times 2 + 5 \times 4 + 1 \times 2 = 117\text{¢}$.
11. **97** $25 \times 2 + 10 \times 3 + 5 \times 2 + 1 \times 7 = 97\text{¢}$.
12. **106** $25 \times 3 + 10 \times 1 + 5 \times 3 + 1 \times 6 = 106\text{¢}$.
13. **92** $25 \times 2 + 10 \times 3 + 5 \times 2 + 1 \times 2 = 92\text{¢}$.
14. **84** $25 \times 2 + 10 \times 3 + 5 \times 0 + 1 \times 4 = 84\text{¢}$.
15. **44** $25 \times 1 + 10 \times 1 + 5 \times 0 + 1 \times 9 = 44\text{¢}$.
16. **23** $25 \times 0 + 10 \times 1 + 5 \times 2 + 1 \times 3 = 23\text{¢}$.
17. **41** $25 \times 0 + 10 \times 3 + 5 \times 1 + 1 \times 6 = 41\text{¢}$.
18. **59** $25 \times 1 + 10 \times 1 + 5 \times 3 + 1 \times 9 = 59\text{¢}$.
