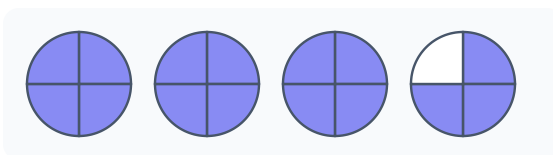

Answer Key

1. $\frac{14}{6} 2 \times 6 + 2 = 14$, so $14/6$.
2. $1\frac{1}{4} 5 \div 4 = 1$ remainder 1, so $1\frac{1}{4}$.
3. **11** $3 \times 3 + 2 = 11$.
4. **25** Each whole = $5/5$, so 5 wholes = $25/5$.
5. **Yes** $5 > 4$, so $5/4$ is greater than 1 (it is $1\frac{1}{4}$).
6. **6** $2 = 6/3$ because $2 \times 3 = 6$.
7. **6** Each whole = $2/2$, so 3 wholes = $6/2$.
8. **6** Each whole = $3/3$, so 2 wholes = $6/3$.
9. **8** Each whole = $4/4$, so 2 wholes = $8/4$.
10. $\frac{15}{4}$ 3 wholes = $12/4$; plus $3/4 = 15/4$.
11. $\frac{7}{2} 3 \times 2 + 1 = 7$, so $7/2$.
12. $2\frac{1}{3} 7 \div 3 = 2$ remainder 1, so $2\frac{1}{3}$.
13. **6** $1 \times 4 + 2 = 6$.
14. **30** Each whole = $6/6$, so 5 wholes = $30/6$.
15. **Yes** $5 > 3$, so $5/3$ is greater than 1 (it is $1\frac{2}{3}$).
16. **24** $6 = 24/4$ because $6 \times 4 = 24$.
17. **4** Each whole = $2/2$, so 2 wholes = $4/2$.
18. **9** Each whole = $3/3$, so 3 wholes = $9/3$.
